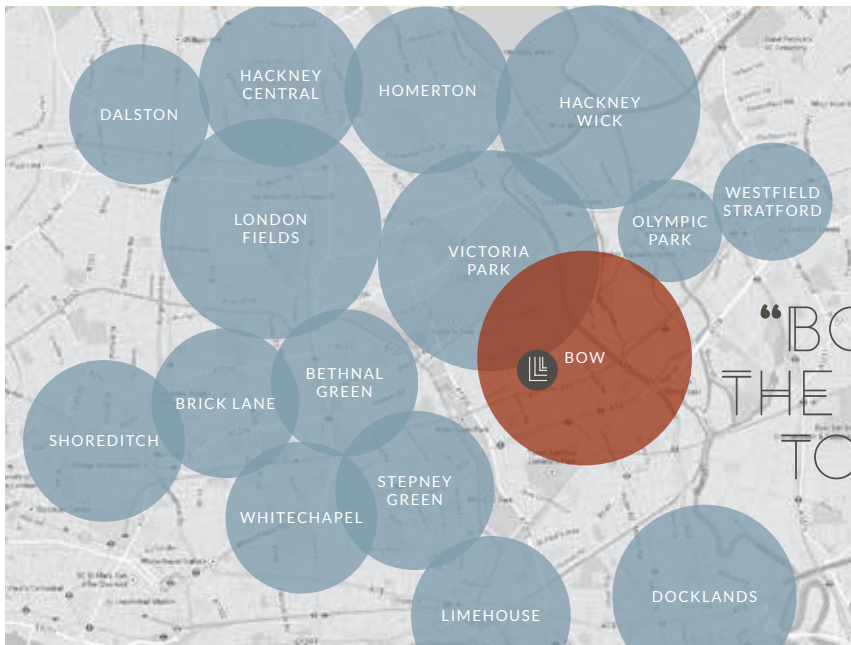

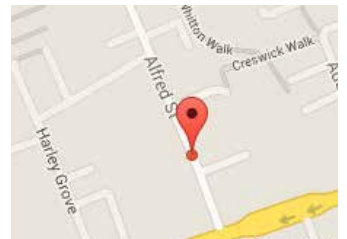

WHITECHAPEL GALLERY

Founded in 1901 to 'bring great art to the people of East End' showcases world-class artists from modern masters such as Pablo Picasso and Jackson Pollock, to contemporaries such as Sophie Call and Paul Thomas Struth. With beautiful galleries,

exhibitions, artist commissions, collection displays, historic archives, education resources, inspiring art courses, Cafe/ Bar and Bookshop, the Gallery is open all year round, so there is always something free to see. <http://www.whitechapelgallery.org/about/>

THE CHISENHALE GALLERY

With up to five major exhibitions each year The Chisenhale Gallery is just down the road from The Lansbury Lofts. In their own words: For audiences, Chisenhale Gallery provides an opportunity to experience the process of art production intimately – this is a place where

art is not collected for presentation but where it is made – and this in itself provides important learning opportunities to critically reflect and participate. THE NUNNERY GALLERY

Open six days a week, The Nunnery Gallery is housed in a unique building on the ground floor of a former convent, and surrounded by Bow Arts studios just off Bow Road. The Gallery programmes a mixed exhibition programme to

MARKETS

One of the things East London is most well-known for is the colourful street scene, including everything from, street markets, festivals, pop-up food stands, open air art installations and the popular flower market. You'd certainly never be short of options to get out and about around Bow. Just remember to take your shopping basket.

ROMAN ROAD MARKET

This old East End favourite fills the street along the East side of Roman Road on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays. You'll find everything from fashion stalls to fruit and veg, tasty treats to tempt you, toys, and plenty of hand bags.

COLUMBIA ROAD MARKET

A short walk through the park and along into Bethnal Green will find you at Columbia Road which hosts the ever popular flower market on Sundays from 8am until 3pm. The street is transformed into a sea of colour and sweet fragrances with everything from orchids to orange trees.

BRICK LANE MARKET

Brick Lane has become home to thousands of creative individuals from fine artists to musicians, designers and filmmakers. The area is known as London's Artist Quarter for its myriad of galleries and famous graffiti street art, which features designs by artists such as Banksy, Stik, ROA, D*Face and Bern Eine. Boutique shops, retro stores and pop-ups, a huge selection of restaurants and bars, including the famous Truman Brewery and Sunday street market can all be found on Brick Lane.

BROADWAY MARKET

Broadway Market on Saturdays is a kaleidoscope of tastes and cultures: stalls, shops, pubs, restaurants and cafes offering some of the best food and most original clothing in London all crammed into a little East End street between the Regent's Canal and London Fields.

REIGNING VICTORIOUS



VARIETY IN VICTORIA PARK

Living at The Lansbury Lofts, you are a stone's throw away from the fantastic 86 hectares of Victoria Park and all it has to offer.

TENNIS

Wimbledon is a fine example of how tennis can capture a country, and those aspiring tennis players can brush up on their skills on one of the four tennis courts that are located inside the park.

CRICKET

During the summer cricket is played every evening on the park's three all-weather wickets, organised by the Victoria Park Community Cricket League. The park also has a popular three-lane cricket net, free to use at all times.

CYCLING

With a large paved track that runs the full perimeter of the park, Victoria Park is just perfect for both runners and cyclists, with plenty of room for those commuting by bike, or simply taking some exercise.

SKATEPARK

Victoria Park is also home to a quirky skatepark, the main feature being a huge bowl with small, mid and deep sections and a massive cradle for the more adventurous.

VICTORIA PARK HARRIERS

The Park is the home of Tower Hamlets Football Club and Victoria Park United Football club, Victoria Park Harriers & Tower Hamlets Athletics Club, which has its headquarters at St. Augustine's Hall located at the north-east corner of the Park. The Club celebrated its 80th Anniversary in 2006.

PEDALOS

During a recent refurbishment of the boating lake, pedalos have been re-introduced to the park, and are very popular during the balmy summer days.

LOVEBOX FESTIVAL

"Back in 2002, Groove Armada and our own Jools were sitting in a pub, lamenting the London parties scene. They were playing gigs and clubs everywhere, but thought there might be a way to put on a different kind of show in London, with more exciting line-ups. It started with a box of records and a pack of Post-its – heart-shaped ones were the only type to hand. The record box became the 'Lovebox', which became an album, and then the first party was thrown in an old strip club off Tottenham Court Road. Then followed a residency at 93 Feet East, succeeded by a stint in Ladbroke Grove, and Lovebox was selling out two weeks in advance with hundreds turning up at the door.

A year later, this success led to a one day special on Clapham Common for 10,000 people. The year after was 20,000. A combination of solid musical reputation and a complete lack of inner London park festivals proved a potent recipe. Then in 2005, Lovebox moved to Victoria Park, spread itself over two days and the festival you know was born."

THE HUB OF LONDON

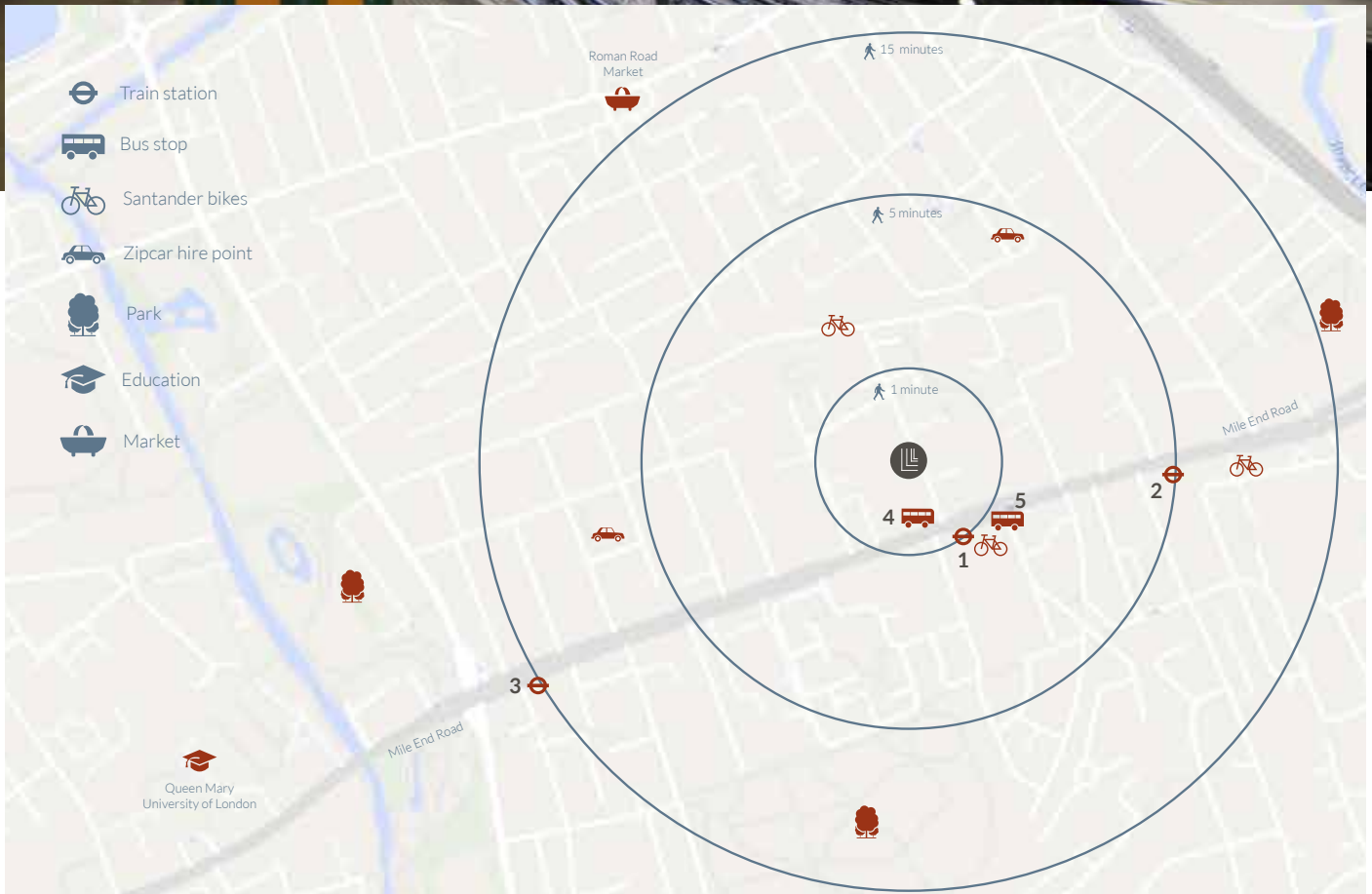
London has one of the largest concentrations of universities and higher education institutions in the world, with over 40, not counting foreign Universities with London branches, and has a student population of more than 400,000.

With such good transport links from the Lansbury Lofts, all of the London's finest academic institutions are within reach making it a perfect location for those looking to study in The Capital.

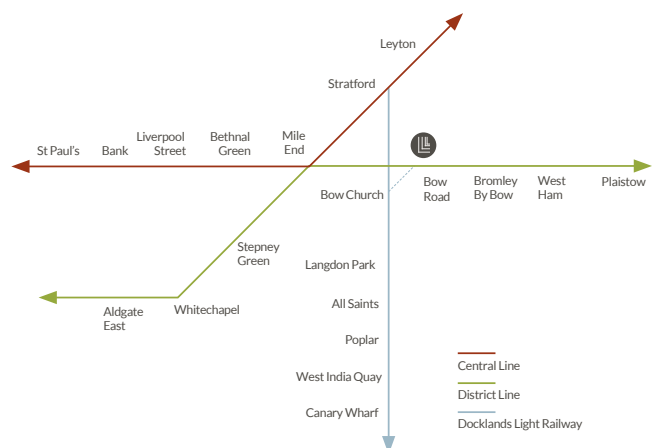


HERE, THERE & EVERYWHERE

2. **Bow Church DLR Station** – direct links to Canary Wharf and Stratford
3. **Mile End Underground Station** – for the Central Line – direct link to Liverpool Street (4 minutes), Oxford Circus, and two minutes to Stratford International
