Let's talk energy efficiency

Homes that comply with up-to-date building regulations for insulation and energy efficiency are also more likely to help you save money as we see prices rise. One thing to keep an eye out for is your home's PEA (Predicted Energy Assessment) or EPC (Energy Performance Certificate) rating, which reviews a property's energy efficiency and carbon dioxide emissions.

All our homes at London Square are built with energy efficiency in mind. Our apartment schemes are fitted with PV panels, which help heat the communal areas and increase overall efficiency.

Our apartments at London Square Watford have a Predicted Energy Assessment (PEA) of B and C, whilst homes at London Square Croydon all have PEAs of B. Our final 3 bedroom houses at London Square Walton on Thames have an EPC rating B.

Did you know that from 2025, EPC requirements for landlords are changing through the introduction of a minimum energy rating of 'C' or above for all tenancies. In order to increase a 2nd hand home's EPC rating to meet a C level could incur a substantial cash injection.

The regulation changes hope to make homes more energy-efficient and reduce carbon emissions as part of the government target to be net-zero by 2050.
