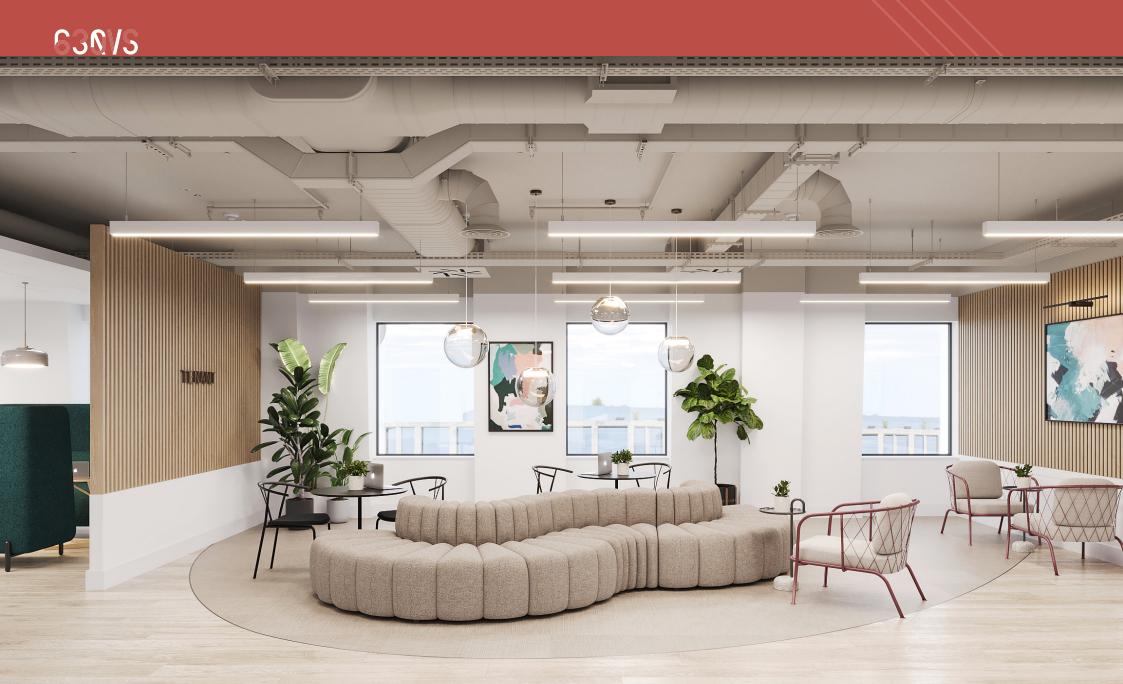

The building is undergoing a transformation to provide 4,340 sq ft of best in class design-led workspace, ready for occupation from Q3 2024. The sense of arrival will be elevated, with a newly configured reception and improved common areas.

The 5th floor, which sits at the top of the building, will be delivered with a new 'ready to work' fit out, designed with collaboration and creativity in mind. The floor will benefit from a new VRF air conditioning system, providing 'all-electric' energy efficiency.

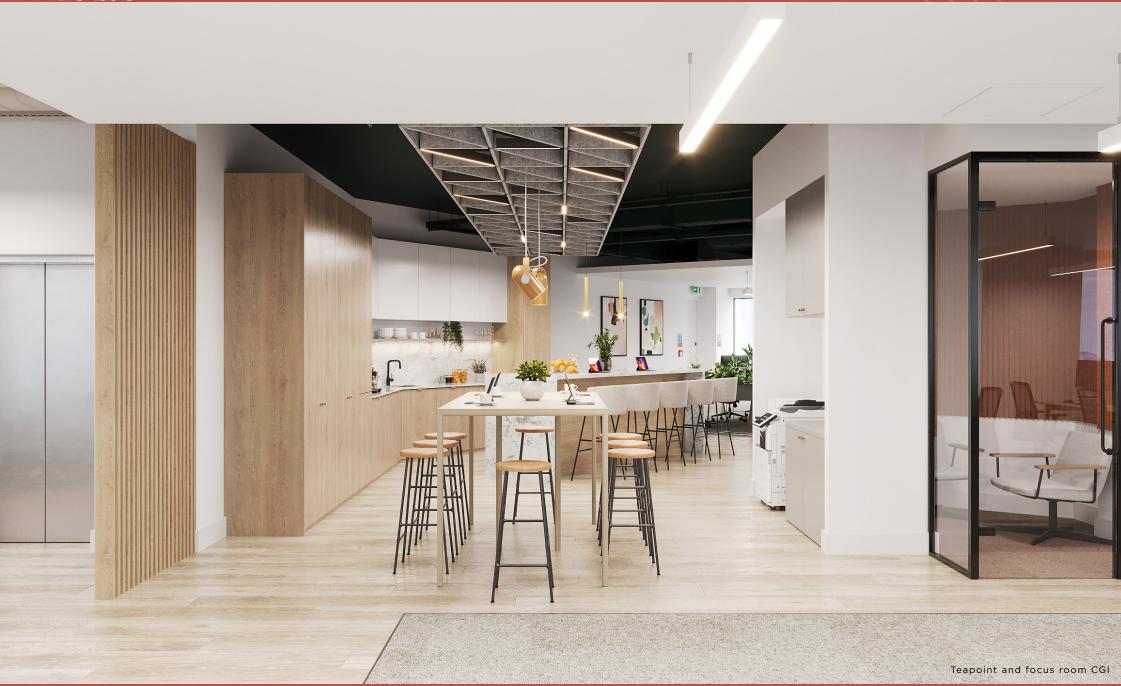




5TH FLOOR PLAN

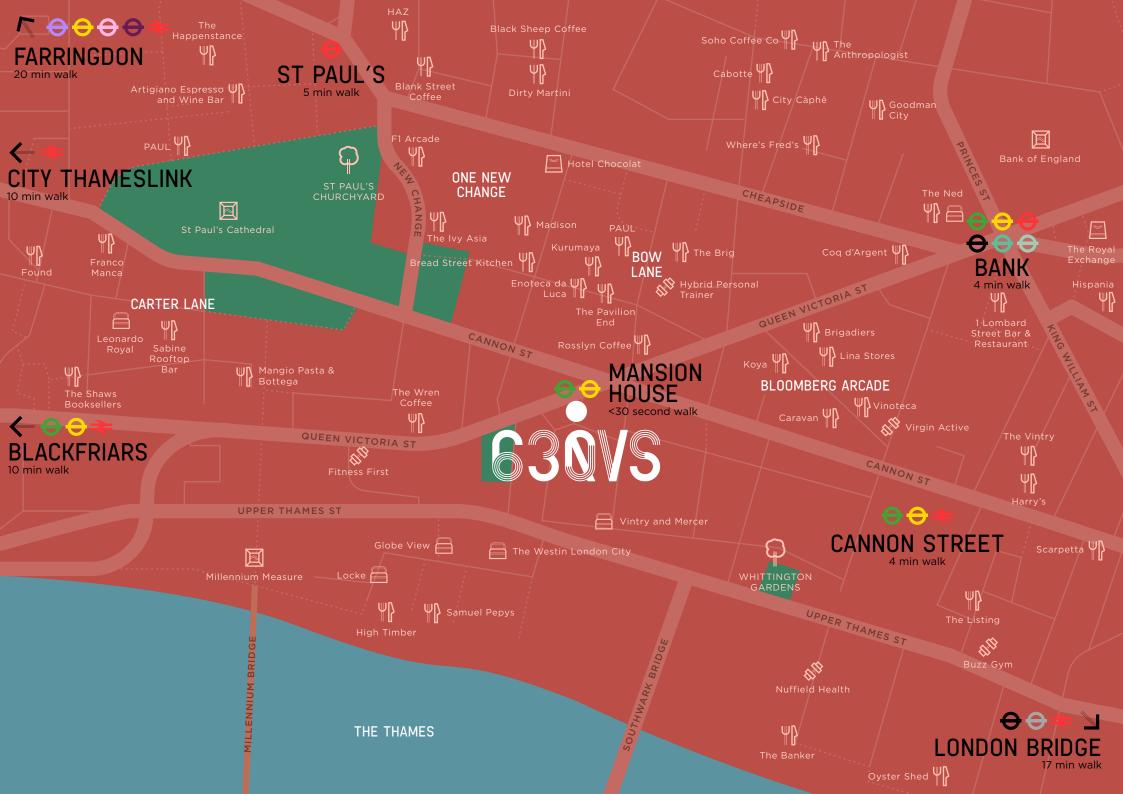
