### Three Holes

A TRANQUIL RIVERSIDE GEM

A small village just inside the Norfolk boundary, Three Holes lies between Wisbech and Ely. The village has a playing field and village hall. Previously a popular fishing spot, it's attracted anglers from far afield but, although the rivers are well-stocked with roach, pike, bream and eels, it's fished to a much lesser degree today.

It's roughly equidistant between Wisbech, March and Downham Market, each around 6 miles away, with Wisbech having a variety of shops, amenities and schools, including Wisbech Grammar School. Downham Market also offers a range of shops and amenities, and a mainline railway station to Ely, Cambridge and London Kings Cross.

Downham Market is one of Norfolk's oldest market towns and it can be traced back to Saxon times. The town has a good range of shops and a busy market on Fridays and Saturdays as well as a college and a range of schools and nurseries. There are many attractive buildings and an unusual gothic black and white town clock. It is an ideal place for walking or cycling and the peaceful waterways are excellent for boating and fishing. Nearby at Welney is the famous Wildfowl and Wetlands Trust nature reserve, which is very popular with birdwatchers.

King's Lynn has an excellent variety of shops, supermarkets, places to eat, ten-pin bowling alley, swimming pool, football club, cinema, theatre and three impressive churches. There are many services within the town including the Queen Elizabeth Hospital, police station, fire station, primary and secondary schools, college and a library. King's Lynn is connected to the local cities of Norwich and Peterborough via the A47 and to Cambridge via the A10. There is a mainline rail link via Cambridge to London King's Cross (1 hour and 40 minutes).
