While a front door opens onto the peaceful street, true to local tradition, day-to-day life is welcomed through a shared arched passageway that leads into a wonderfully private rear garden and through the inviting kitchen door.

Inside, the ground floor has been thoughtfully reconfigured to create a light and flowing layout. The sitting room to the front, complete with its original working fireplace, is the perfect place to retreat on a winter's evening, while the open-plan kitchen and dining area to the rear is ideal for both relaxed family life and entertaining. The connection between the two rooms allows natural light to pour in throughout the day, enhancing the sense of space and warmth.

Period details, including fireplaces and exposed features, have been lovingly retained, celebrating the home's heritage while offering all the comforts of modern living.

The first floor offers two comfortable double bedrooms, each with their own charm and character. The principal bedroom enjoys an outlook over the rooftops and the church tower of St Mary's – a timeless view of village life. Both bedrooms are served by a well-appointed bathroom located on the ground floor, discreetly positioned just off the kitchen.

To the rear, the garden is a true hidden gem – fully enclosed, south-facing, and bathed in sunshine for most of the day. Cleverly landscaped with a patioed terrace, it is a tranquil and completely private space to enjoy summer dining, morning coffee, or an evening glass of wine as the sun sets gently over the rooftops of Burnham Market.
