A pristine white frontage complete with decorative corbels, a classic checkerboard tiled perron and an eye-catching sky blue door give the most wonderful curb appeal. On entering from the raised ground floor, an entrance hallway with a stained glass window interior door, wood flooring and ornamental moldings, provides access to all rooms. A generously-sized double reception room has high ceilings and is filled with an abundance of natural light. A well-placed w/c is accessible from the entrance hallway. The contemporary kitchen and dining room spans the entire width of the property, and has the added benefit of a large utility room set behind. The room also has direct access to the rear garden and a second street entrance.
