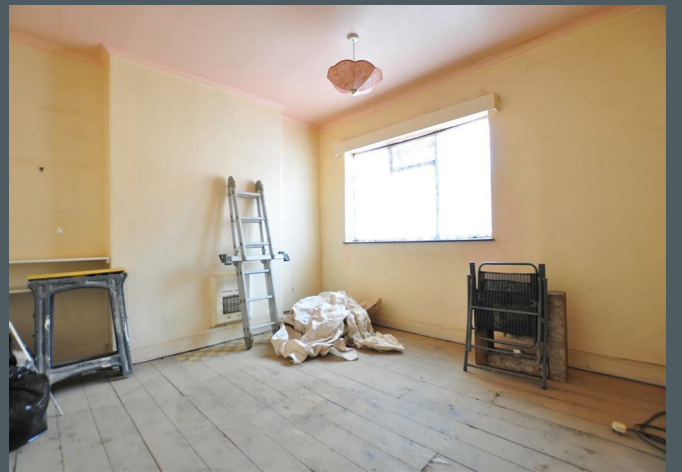
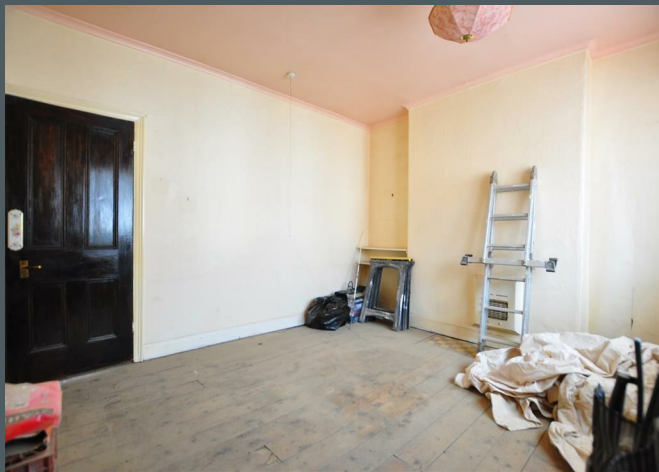

Location

Halesowen lies approximately 7 miles from Birmingham City Centre and is just minutes away from junction 3 of the M5 motorway giving access to the greater motorway network all around the West Midlands. The History of Halesowen stems back as far as the Anglo Saxons and it was listed in the Domesday Book as being larger than Birmingham. It forms part of the southern edge of the Black Country and during the industrial revolution it became synonymous with nail and screw making, an industry that still survives to a lesser extent today. Despite its proximity to the Black Country it still retains areas of beauty and Grade I listed Leasowes Park is thought to be one of the first natural landscape gardens in England. In certain areas the town is predominated by a vast array of Victorian houses but further development during the 1960's and 70's saw the building of several large housing estates. It has a number of highly sought after primary and secondary schools. Whilst Halesowen no longer has a train station of its own the Worcester to Birmingham line passes along the northern edge of its boundary and the stations of Cradley Heath, Old Hill and Rowley Regis are all within a few miles of the town centre. Halesowen bus station is a busy interchange and regular service runs to Birmingham City Centre.



Approach

Via slabbed parking area to side, small fore garden stepping into:

Entrance hall

Double glazed door to front, cupboard off and storage heater.

Front reception room 10'9" x 8'6" max 7'10" min (3.3 x 2.6 max 2.4 min)

Double glazed window to front and open fire.

Reception room two 11'1" min 12'5" max x 11'9" (3.4 min 3.8 max x 3.6)

Double glazed window to rear, gas fire with feature surround and storage heater.

Kitchen 11'5" x 7'10" (3.5 x 2.4)

Double glazed window to side, range of wall and base units with work surface over incorporating sink with mixer tap, tiling to splashbacks, gas fire with feature surround, space and plumbing for washing machine and cupboard off.

Downstairs bathroom

Tiled flooring and splashbacks, shower enclosure with shower over, wash hand basin with mixer tap and storage below, double glazed window to rear, wall mounted fan heater and w.c.

First floor landing

Double glazed window to rear and doors radiating to:

Bedroom one 11'5" min 12'1" max x 11'1" (3.5 min 3.7 max x 3.4)

Double glazed window to front.

Bedroom two 12'1" x 8'2" min 9'2" max (3.7 x 2.5 min 2.8 max)

Double glazed window to rear, cupboard off.

Rear garden

With slabbed seating area, beds with various plants and shrubs, store room and timber fencing to enclose.

Tenure
