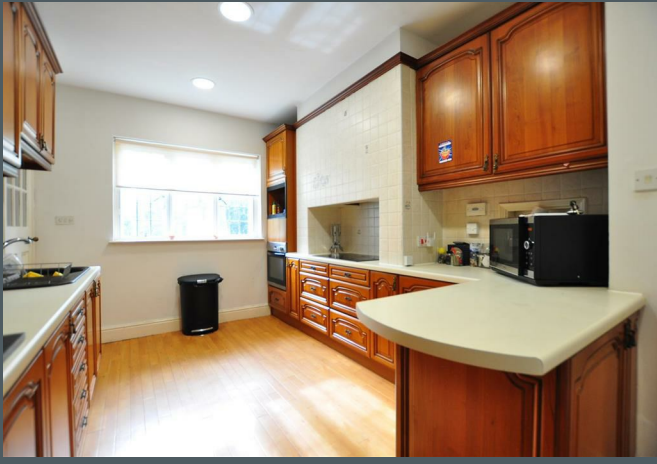

Location

Halesowen lies approximately 7 miles from Birmingham City Centre and is just minutes away from junction 3 of the M5 motorway giving access to the greater motorway network all around the West Midlands. The History of Halesowen stems back as far as the Anglo Saxons and it was listed in the Domesday Book as being larger than Birmingham. It forms part of the southern edge of the Black Country and during the industrial revolution it became synonymous with nail and screw making, an industry that still survives to a lesser extent today. Despite its proximity to the Black Country it still retains areas of beauty and Grade I listed Leasowes Park is thought to be one of the first natural landscape gardens in England. In certain areas the town is predominated by a vast array of Victorian houses but further development during the 1960's and 70's saw the building of several large housing estates. It has a number of highly sought after primary and secondary schools. Whilst Halesowen no longer has a train station of its own the Worcester to Birmingham line passes along the northern edge of its boundary and the stations of Cradley Heath, Old Hill and Rowley Regis are all within a few miles of the town centre. Halesowen bus station is a busy interchange and regular service runs to Birmingham City Centre.

Approach

Via tarmac driveway offering parking for a number of cars, lawn area, beds with various plants and shrubs, hedging, step up into:

Entrance hall

Central heating radiator, stained glass door to front, wooden boarded flooring, stairs rising to first floor accommodation and cupboard off.

Lounge 12'5" max 12'1" min x 18'4" (3.8 max 3.7 min x 5.6)

Central heating radiator, windows to front, rear and side.











Dining room 10'9" min 11'9" max x 15'5" max 11'9" min (3.3 min 3.6 max x 4.7 max 3.6 min)
Bay window to rear, central heating radiator.

Kitchen 16'0" x 8'2" min 9'10" max (4.9 x 2.5 min 3.0 max)
Window to rear, range of wall and base units with work surface over incorporating sink with mixer tap over, ceramic hob, oven, central heating radiator, tiling to splashbacks.

Downstairs w.c.
With tiled flooring, central heating radiator, low level w.c., wash hand basin with mixer tap over and window to front.

Utility room
Window to side, central heating radiator, range of wall and base units with work surface over incorporating sink with mixer tap, space and plumbing for washing machine, door leading to second w.c.

Second w.c.
With wash hand basin with mixer tap over, low level w.c., tiled splashbacks and double glazed window to side.

Study 14'9" x 8'6" max 7'10" min (4.5 x 2.6 max 2.4 min)
Central heating radiator, window to front and side.

First floor landing
Feature stained glass window to front and side, central heating radiator, cupboard off, doors radiating to:

Bedroom one 18'4" x 12'1" min 12'5" max (5.6 x 3.7 min 3.8 max)
Window to front and rear, central heating radiator.

Bedroom two 11'9" x 14'9" max 11'9" min (3.6 x 4.5 max 3.6 min)
Bay window to rear, central heating radiator.

Bedroom three 9'10" x 8'6" (3.0 x 2.6)
With window to rear, central heating radiator.

Bathroom
With fully tiled floor and walls, low level w.c., heated towel rail, window to side, bath with mixer tap over, shower enclosure with shower, wash hand basin with mixer tap and storage below, extractor fan.





Rear garden

Slabbed patio area and pathway, lawn, bedding with various plants and shrubs and various hedges to enclose.
